

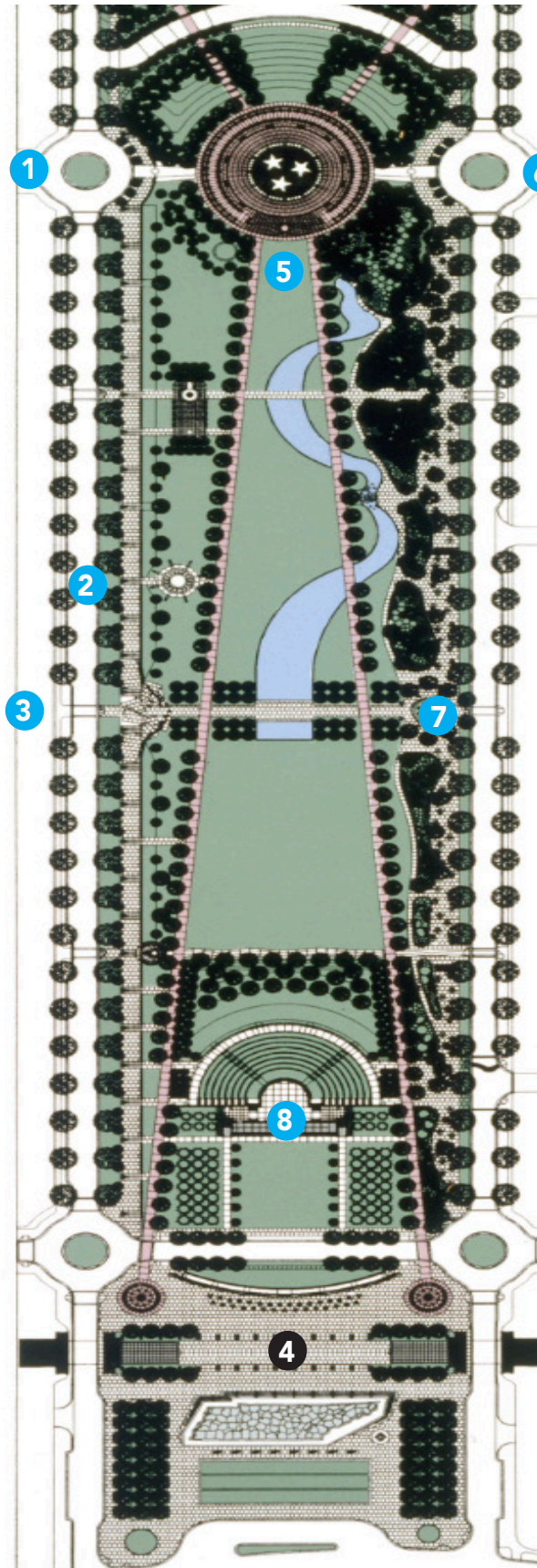
Q: Why is this a *Bi-Centennial Mall*?

A*: Because it was built to commemorate Tennessee's second century, or 'Bi-Centennial' Anniversary in 1996.

The Mall design displays over 200 years, or two centuries of history, since the State's founding in 1796.

Draw a line to all 8 Sights**:

- 1. The Tennessee State Museum**
open to the public with special exhibits.
- 2. Pathway of History**
trace geological periods to the 1996 era.
- 3. Farmers Market**
offers shopping, a food court and more.
- 4. Railroad Trestle, Tennessee Plaza with Rivers and State Map**
Walk in the water, and trace roads that crisscross the State's 95 counties engraved on a map which connects us to eight bordering states!

5. 95 Bell-Carillon chiming on each half hour, with a 96th Answer Bell ringing from Capitol Hill. Every 30 minutes songs written by or familiar to many people, ring-out acoustically across the city in range of 4 octaves.

6. The Tennessee State Archives and Library open for educational research and historical documents.

7. Walkway of the Counties 95 Counties medallions stretch along the east walkway.

8. Capitol Amphitheater, located at the south end there is a raised platform with the backdrop of our State Capitol. The natural acoustics travel upward, allowing the sound to be heard by a hillside audience.
